### THE STORY

True Grit Redi-Mix operates 15 Redi-Mix and tank Mack Trucks from their north Fort Worth yard, and has converted to 238 Ultra Supreme Moly Grease to lower costs and increase equipment reliability. Ken Daley, the shop foreman, said that the bull ring rollers on his trucks needed to be re-greased every time they came in from a job as they are pressure washed to get the days concrete off before it hardened. His previous grease would be washed off with the concrete, so a complete re-greasing was required. When he switched, he saw immediately that the Schaeffer 238 was still there after the pressure washing. He was amazed!

He also noted that during his weekly greasing of all the fittings that instead of the normal amount he used to put in each fitting, the fitting would only take a "topping off" of grease, estimated to be less than 25% of what he was putting in. He now greases each truck every other week, and is still using about 50% of what he used to.

In addition to the 238 Ultra, Ken uses Supreme 7000 oil and 293 7590 gear oil, 239S 50 transmission oil, Diesel Treat, Penetro and Citrol.
